DfE information for families over the Easter holidays:

Parents/carers of pupils need to inform the school head@goostrey.cheshire.sch.uk of a case where a pupil has tested positive within 48 hours of last being in school. The school should then assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in their education setting. Where pupils test positive for COVID 19 during the holidays, more than 48 hours since being in school, you are not required to inform the school but should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

#### **Contact Tracing**

As children return to school it is likely that we will see more instances of positive cases and the need for schools to complete contact tracing. As a reminder the definition of a close contact is:

A contact is defined as a person who has had contact (see below) at any time from **two days** before onset of symptoms (or time of test if asymptomatic) to 10 days after onset of symptoms (or test):

a person who has had face-to-face contact (within one metre) with someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), including:

being coughed on, or

having a face-to-face conversation, or

having skin-to-skin physical contact, or

any contact within one metre for one minute or longer without face-to-face contact

a person who has been within 2 metres of someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) for more than 15 minutes

a person who has travelled in a small vehicle *with* someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or in a large vehicle *near* someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19)

people who spend significant time in the same household as a person who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19)

You will notice that the infectious period has been updated to 2 full days before the onset of symptoms or test.



Before entering any part of the school building please read the questions below:

In the last 14 days have you or any member of your household tested positive for Covid-19?

In the last 14 days have you or any member of your household displayed symptoms of Covid-19?
High temperature
New continuous cough
Loss of, or change to, your sense of taste/smell

Have you been identified by test and trace, or any other official source, as a 'close contact' of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, within the last 14 days?

If you have answered yes to any of the above, please DO NOT enter the school building.

### **Change in Isolation Date for Close Contacts**

The <u>Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus</u> (<u>COVID-19</u>) <u>infection</u> has changed meaning that self-isolation for contacts of people with confirmed coronavirus has shortened from 14 to 10 days.

Key summary points of the new isolation guidance include:

As of Monday 14<sup>th</sup> December 2020, the isolation period reduced to 10 days.

Isolation periods will take the day contact occurred as Day 0 of the isolation period, so contacts must remain in isolation until Day 11.

# COVID-19 (coronavirus) absence: A quick guide for parents / carers
