





Covid update:

Despite some easing of restrictions nationally, last Monday, there has been very little relaxing to the guidance for schools —some minor changes around mask wearing in classrooms, after school activities can move to indoors (still in bubbles) and some residential visits can resume in England, but with a lot of restrictions around them. The concern around the Indian variant has resulted in schools being reminded daily by PHE, DfE and the LA that we must be extra vigilant and not take any risks for everyone's safety. One of the things we have to adhere to is if we invite people in to school we have to know who they are and where they are, ensure all social distancing, masks etc. We also have to have all their contact details in case we have to work with Track and Trace. We want to return to normal as soon as possible and be able to have you, our families, in school again but for the moment our risk assessment and restrictions are very much the same as they were on 23rd April. We have done so well, so far, protecting our pupils, staff and hopefully the whole school community. Our full risk assessment is on the website, as soon as any guidance is updated we will review and hopefully relax some of our procedures. I hope this has been helpful in understanding the ongoing constraints on visitors and events and that guidance for schools hasn't changed despite the restrictions easing in general.

Swimming Lessons Summer Term 2021 FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN IN THE JUNIORS

As we are sure you are aware, in normal times, as part of the PE curriculum, pupils have swimming lessons at Sandbach Leisure Centre. In light of the current pandemic we have found an alternative to travelling to a public facility, and have a temporary pool on site, which is working extremely well.

In previous years we would ask for a voluntary contribution towards the cost of transport to lessons, and the school budget covered the cost of pool hire and coaching staff. This year is very different. The pool hire on site, with trained coach and lifeguard, installation of power supply for the heating, and the increase in utility costs for water and electricity will cost the budget more than we would normally be charged for lessons off site—adding up to several thousand pounds.

We are appealing for voluntary contributions towards the additional utilities costs. Should anyone be willing to make a contribution, this can be done online, at www.cheshireeast.gov.uk/schoolshop where an amount of £10 has been set up, but partial payment of a different amount can be made.

Any voluntary contributions will be very much appreciated.

Families of pupils who are registered as eligible for Free School Meals are not asked to make any contribution.

Before entering any part of the school building please read the questions below:

In the last 14 days have you or any member of your household tested positive for Covid-19?

In the last 14 days have you or any member of your household displayed symptoms of Covid-19?
High temperature
New continuous cough
Loss of, or change to, your sense of taste/smell

Have you been identified by test and trace, or any other official source, as a 'close contact' of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, within the last 14 days?

If you have answered yes to any of the above, please DO NOT enter the school building.

Update to the following pages from PHE

A contact is defined as a person who has had contact (see below) at any time from **two days** before onset of symptoms (or time of test if asymptomatic) to 10 days after onset of symptoms (or test):

a person who has had face-to-face contact (within one metre) with someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), including:

being coughed on, or having a face-to-face conversation, or having skin-to-skin physical contact, or any contact within one metre for one minute or longer without face-to-face contact

- a person who has been within 2 metres of someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) for more than 15 minutes
- a person who has travelled in a small vehicle *with* someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or in a large vehicle *near* someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19)

people who spend significant time in the same household as a person who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19)

A guide to regular rapid Covid-19 testing



Regular rapid testing is now available for parents, their households and bubbles.

Regular rapid testing is a fast and easy way to find out if you have coronavirus and help protect your loved ones and community.

It's free and takes around 30 minutes.

Why introduce regular rapid testing?

Up to 1 in 3 people who have Covid-19 have no symptoms and could be spreading it without knowing.

Regular rapid testing is now available for parents of nursery, school children and college students. As well as adults in their households, childcare and support bubbles.

Regular testing for people without symptoms is already taking place across the country. Thousands of people who didn't know they had the virus have been able to take action to stop the spread of the disease.

As lockdown restrictions ease, getting into the regular habit of twice weekly testing will play an important role in getting back to normal; alongside the vaccine, following the hands, face, space guidance, and social distancing measures.

Regular testing for school staff and students

Regular rapid testing is already available to all staff at nursery, primary and secondary schools and colleges.

Secondary school and college students aged 11 and above will continue to access regular rapid tests directly through their school or college. And we continue to encourage them to get tested.

On return they will initially be supervised while testing at school and then continue to test themselves at home with test kits they will get from school or college.

Nursery and primary school children are not being asked to be tested as evidence continues to show that children and young people are at low risk from Covid-19 and are very unlikely to get seriously ill.

What is the benefit to you?

By taking part in regular rapid testing, you'll be protecting yourself and your loved ones. And helping us all get back to a more normal way of life.
