Dear Families,

Children in Years 3 and 4 enjoyed their sports days last Tuesday, albeit a little wet. The other classes are having their sports sessions today. I have just been across to watch the Reception class race—the Year 6 were also enjoying watching them. Thank you to the PTA for the very welcome ice lollies. We all hope Sunday's match is as successful as our sports days. Around school I heard repeated renditions of Sweet Caroline over and over yesterday.

Very little will change in school, for our final four days from July 19th, especially as Cheshire East remains a higher risk area for Covid transmissions. We do not want to alter our practice and mix groups, just in case this leads to positive cases through transmission in school .This could result in pupils having to isolate, spoiling their holiday plans, before the new rules around close contacts come in on the 16th August.

I am hopeful things will be very different, in school, from September. Cheshire East is working with Public Health and Education Recovery group to provide any local practical advice for September and this will come to schools in Mid-August. When we receive this advice we will review our risk assessments and procedures and I will email all our families, so you are up to date with the arrangements for the new school year.

We are planning our whole school exhibition for October—please see page 2 for holiday homework. The theme of our Exhibition is **ONE WORLD SEVEN CONTINENTS**, **ONE SCHOOL SEVEN CLASSES**. I am asking for photographs, of your child/ren around this theme—be as creative as you think—the photo could be connected to one of the continents or to the number 7 or to our school. Please keep the photograph quite small, no bigger than 10 x 15 cm please. I will be collecting them in at the end of September, they will then go on display at the entrance to the exhibition—thank you

Pupil school reports will come home next Friday—please let the class teacher know if you would like to arrange a meeting (phone call) to discuss

Please keep sending your child's achievements for the newsletter so we can celebrate them together. I love reading about everything the pupils are doing both in and out of school.



A guide to regular rapid Covid-19 testing



Regular rapid testing is now available for parents, their households and bubbles.

Regular rapid testing is a fast and easy way to find out if you have coronavirus and help protect your loved ones and community. It's free and takes around 30 minutes.

Why introduce regular rapid testing?

Up to 1 in 3 people who have Covid-19 have no symptoms and could be spreading it without knowing.

Regular rapid testing is now available for parents of nursery, school children and college students. As well as adults in their households, childcare and support bubbles.

Regular testing for people without symptoms is already taking place across the country. Thousands of people who didn't know they had the virus have been able to take action to stop the spread of the disease.

As lockdown restrictions ease, getting into the regular habit of twice weekly testing will play an important role in getting back to normal; alongside the vaccine, following the hands, face, space guidance, and social distancing measures.

Regular testing for school staff and students

Regular rapid testing is already available to all staff at nursery, primary and secondary schools and colleges.

Secondary school and college students aged 11 and above will continue to access regular rapid tests directly through their school or college. And we continue to encourage them to get tested.

On return they will initially be supervised while testing at school and then continue to test themselves at home with test kits they will get from school or college.

Nursery and primary school children are not being asked to be tested as evidence continues to show that children and young people are at low risk from Covid-19 and are very unlikely to get seriously ill.

What is the benefit to you?

By taking part in regular rapid testing, you'll be protecting yourself and your loved ones. And helping us all get back to a more normal way of life.
