School funding petition

You have possibly seen previous information about the unfair funding schools in Cheshire East receive. Cheshire East remains one of the lowest funded authorities nationally and the current national fairer funding proposals do not address the significant variations in funding schools receive across the country. Schools in Cheshire East do an amazing job achieving excellent outcomes for Children and Young People but behind the scenes schools are struggling to balance the budget.

Cheshire East Council together with the full school community is committed to campaigning for fairer funding. The Leader of the Council, Cllr Rachel Bailey, and the Portfolio Holder for Children and Families, Cllr Jos Saunders, are committed to support any campaign but it is the voice of our schools and families that has the greatest impact.

Nationally, a School Funding Petition has been developed which all Cabinet Members, and Senior Officers in the Council have signed including the Chief Executive, Executive Director for People and the Director of Education.

We would like to ensure the results of the Campaign highlight the strength of feeling about school funding for Cheshire East Schools ensuring we are the area with the highest level of responses by a significant majority, if possible.

FOGS wins the Northern Youth Challenge award 2018!

FOGS members are delighted to announce another win in the Cheshire Best Kept Station Competition (BKSC).

The Northern Youth Challenge Award for 2018 is a reward not just for the Friends of Goostrey Station but for the children of **Goostrey Community Primary School**, the local Cubs and Beavers plus our Duke of Edinburgh Award candidates. We are working together to improve our station and to learn about the history of the railway through Goostrey. The displays of artwork, railway memorabilia and flowering plants showed the judges that the community of Goostrey cares about the appearance of their station.

Previously FOGS has received three other awards from Cheshire BKSC : for most improved station in 2014, for Art in 2016 and for Diversity in 2017. In addition, FOGS has been shortlisted twice by the Association of Community of Rail Partnerships (ACoRP) : for Small Art Projects in 2017 and for the Diversity Award in 2018.

We have even impressed the Northern Revenue Team as revealed by a recent entry in the comments book in the platform shelter :

We love coming to Goostrey.

The restoration of the outside of our historic old ticket office continues. Chair of FOGS Mike Jarvis has heard that there is a target date of May 2019 for the owners Network Rail to complete the outside repairs. At present, FOGS committee members are engaging with the franchise holders Northern Rail regarding the refurbishment of the inside and the process of finding tenants to occupy the building.

Meanwhile it is important that we keep up the good work and it is timely to remind everyone that our working parties continue on the second Sunday of each month from 10 am. Currently we have no store room, so it would be best if helpers could bring tools such as brushes, spades, forks, loppers or secateurs. However there will be a few spare tools available for those not able to bring their own.

While working, every volunteer must wear one of our orange safety jackets since yellow ones can confuse train drivers travelling at speed. Orange is the specified rail safety colour. Please also remember that no-one should work alone at the station in case there is an accident where assistance would be required.

We need more volunteers to come and help us reach our main goal successfully, not just for gardening and tidying but also if you have DIY skills. Now is the time to come and join us! TAKING CHILDREN ON HOLIDAY DURING TERM TIME

A guide for parents and carers

Frequently asked questions

Am I entitled to take my child out of school for a family holiday?

□ **No.** Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school or the alternative provision on a regular basis

□ The Education Act 1996 makes it a criminal offence for a parent to *"fail to secure their child's regular attendance at the school"*

□ The amendments to the 2006 Regulations remove any reference to *family holidays, extended leave and the statutory threshold of ten school days.*

□ The amendments make clear that **Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence** (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances

□ The amendments give **parents no entitlement** to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time

□ The Head Teacher and Governing Body will determine what the exceptional circumstances are

If we decide to take a holiday during term time what should we do?

□ The parent/carer with whom the child resides must apply in writing to the school

□ The letter/application must explain the exceptional circumstance surrounding the request for the leave of absence

What will the school do then?

□ The Head Teacher will determine whether the exceptional circumstance ruling applies, if not the application will be declined

 \circ Only the Headteacher (or the Deputy) has the power to approve leave of absence applications. When making the decision the protocols and criteria laid down in the school's attendance policy must be followed.

 Each academic year, schools inform parents/carers via a letter, newsletter or some other communication; that they may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice if their child has unauthorised absences in term time

□ You will receive a written response from the Headteacher (or the Deputy) letting you know if your application has been approved

□ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded as unauthorised

What will happen if the absence is unauthorised?

□ The school will decide if a Penalty Notice should be issued. If the school decide that a Penalty Notice is to be issued

□ You will receive a letter from the school advising that it has referred the matter to the Local Authority and that a Penalty Notice may be issued;

□ The school will inform the Local Authority that a Penalty Notice needs to be issued

□ A Penalty Notice will be sent to you, accompanied by an explanatory letter; the Notice gives you the opportunity to pay a penalty fine instead of being prosecuted in the criminal courts

Payments will **not** be accepted after the 28th day and payments **cannot** be paid in part or by instalments
