
#### **Mid-Day Assistants Vacancies**

On Monday evening, Mrs Cuttle and I accompanied children from years 3, 4, 5 and 6 to a very successful athletics competition against other schools from our cluster. There were lots of events going on at the same time including long jump, javelin, tug-of-war and various running races so there was something for everyone. It was indeed a very busy afternoon!

The children acquitted themselves really well with some excellent results. I haven't yet received the table of results from Mr Capewell who organised and supervised the event, so I can only mention some of the highlights. Harry and Brianna won their respective long jump competitions - very well done, you two - and Jack S in year 5 came a brilliant second in the 600m. He was competing against a child that is actually running for the Cheshire county team and was only beaten by a very small margin - an excellent result.

Harry in year 5 competed in the year 6 600m and also came second - another marvellous result especially as Harry was only asked to take part in this race at the very last moment. Our relay teams performed brilliantly and I believe that both year 5 girls and boys won their event. We also achieved a great result in the relay medley.

Overall the team came third which is a great result!

Many thanks to Mrs Flint, who did a sterling job in organising which children should take part in each event, and also to Mrs Cuttle for supervising the field events.

Thanks also to the parents/carers/adults who brought the children to the event and to those who stayed to lend their support.



# **ENFORCING** RESTRICTIONS We are asking for your cooperation in making sure that children are safe when they go to school. Cars that are parked irresponsibly by those dropping off children are causing problems for other road users, residents and pedestrians who need to get to school. Traffic and parking issues during school times have been raised as a concern by parents, staff, residents and other children who attend the schools concerned. We are working with schools in your area to stop irresponsible parking as we need to act now and work together to resolve this serious issue. We are sending a leaflet to all parents/guardians to inform them that enforced parking restrictions will be put in place and that anyone who continues to park irresponsibly will receive a fixed penalty notice. All road users need to be aware of and adhere to parking restrictions: No parking on bends Do not park on double lines No parking on zigzag lines Do not park on 'time restricted' single lines Do not obstruct a resident's driveway Do not cause an obstruction

# TAKING CHILDREN ON HOLIDAY DURING TERM TIME

# A guide for parents and carers

Frequently asked questions  Am I entitled to take my child out of school for a family holiday?
<ul> <li>No. Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school or the alternative provision on a regular basis</li> <li>The Education Act 1996 makes it a criminal offence for a parent to "fail to secure their child's regular attendance at the school"</li> <li>The amendments to the 2006 Regulations remove any reference to family holidays, extended leave and the statutory threshold of ten school days.</li> <li>The amendments make clear that Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances</li> <li>The amendments give parents no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time</li> <li>The Head Teacher and Governing Body will determine what the exceptional circumstances are</li> </ul>
If we decide to take a holiday during term time what should we do?
☐ The parent/carer with whom the child resides must apply in writing to the school ☐ The letter/application must explain the exceptional circumstance surrounding the request for the leave of absence
What will the school do then?
<ul> <li>□ The Head Teacher will determine whether the exceptional circumstance ruling applies, if not the application will be declined</li> <li>○ Only the Headteacher (or the Deputy) has the power to approve leave of absence applications. When making the decision the protocols and criteria laid down in the school's attendance policy must be followed.</li> <li>○ Each academic year, schools inform parents/carers via a letter, newsletter or some other communication; that they may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice if their child has unauthorised absences in term time</li> <li>□ You will receive a written response from the Headteacher (or the Deputy) letting you know if your application has been approved</li> <li>□ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded</li> </ul>
$\sqcup$ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

What will happen if the absence is unauthorised?
☐ The school will decide if a Penalty Notice should be issued. If the school decide that a Pen-
alty Notice is to be issued
□ You will receive a letter from the school advising that it has referred the matter to the Local
Authority and that a Penalty Notice may be issued;
☐ The school will inform the Local Authority that a Penalty Notice needs to be issued
□ A Penalty Notice will be sent to you, accompanied by an explanatory letter; the Notice
gives you the opportunity to pay a penalty fine instead of being prosecuted in the criminal
courts

Payments will **not** be accepted after the 28th day and payments **cannot** be paid in part or by instalments
