
Summer holiday home activity For our annual October exhibition

Wild About Goostrey is an awards scheme to enhance biodiversity and connectivity for Goostrey's wildlife. **Simply make one or more of the habitat improvements below** and then proudly display the appropriate "**Wild about Goostrey**" butterfly award:

BRONZE AWARD

Do one or more of the following:

- Erect a standard nest box or bee box
- Plant nectar rich flowers/shrubs
- Plant a native tree
- Leave a patch of grass unmown from March to September
- Create a wood pile

GOLD AWARD

Do one or more of the following:

- Do 5 or more of the bronze and silver projects
- Manage a lawn or paddock as a meadow for butterflies and ground nesting birds
- Plant 10 native trees or manage a wood for wildlife

SILVER AWARD

Do one or more of the following:

- Create a pond
- Plant a native hedge
- Erect a bat box or owl box
- Dispense with slug pellets & weed killer
- Create freedom of movement and housing for hedgehogs

ENFORCING RESTRICTIONS We are asking for your cooperation in making sure that children are safe when they go to school. Cars that are parked irresponsibly by those dropping off children are causing problems for other road users, residents and pedestrians who need to get to school. Traffic and parking issues during school times have been raised as a concern by parents, staff, residents and other children who attend the schools concerned. We are working with schools in your area to stop irresponsible parking as we need to act now and work together to resolve this serious issue. We are sending a leaflet to all parents/guardians to inform them that enforced parking restrictions will be put in place and that anyone who continues to park irresponsibly will receive a fixed penalty notice. All road users need to be aware of and adhere to parking restrictions: No parking on bends Do not park on double lines No parking on zigzag lines Do not park on 'time restricted' single lines Do not obstruct a resident's driveway Do not cause an obstruction

TAKING CHILDREN ON HOLIDAY DURING TERM TIME

A guide for parents and carers

Frequently asked questions Am I entitled to take my child out of school for a family holiday?
\Box No. Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school or the alternative provision on a regular basis
☐ The Education Act 1996 makes it a criminal offence for a parent to "fail to secure their child's regular attendance at the school"
☐ The amendments to the 2006 Regulations remove any reference to <i>family holidays</i> , <i>extended</i> leave and the statutory threshold of ten school days.
☐ The amendments make clear that Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances
☐ The amendments give parents no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time
☐ The Head Teacher and Governing Body will determine what the exceptional circumstances are
If we decide to take a holiday during term time what should we do?
☐ The parent/carer with whom the child resides must apply in writing to the school ☐ The letter/application must explain the exceptional circumstance surrounding the request for the leave of absence
What will the school do then?
☐ The Head Teacher will determine whether the exceptional circumstance ruling applies, if not the application will be declined
 Only the Headteacher (or the Deputy) has the power to approve leave of absence applications. When making the decision the protocols and criteria laid down in the school's attendance policy must be followed.
 Each academic year, schools inform parents/carers via a letter, newsletter or some other communication; that they may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice if their child has unauthorised absences in term time
☐ You will receive a written response from the Headteacher (or the Deputy) letting you know if your application has been approved
$\ \square$ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded as unauthorised

What will happen if the absence is unauthorised?	
☐ The school will decide if a Penalty Notice should be issued. If the school decide that a P	en-
alty Notice is to be issued	
You will receive a letter from the school advising that it has referred the matter to the Lo	cal
Authority and that a Penalty Notice may be issued;	
☐ The school will inform the Local Authority that a Penalty Notice needs to be issued	
□ A Penalty Notice will be sent to you, accompanied by an explanatory letter; the Notice	
gives you the opportunity to pay a penalty fine instead of being prosecuted in the criminal	
courts

Payments will **not** be accepted after the 28th day and payments **cannot** be paid in part or by instalments
