



PE sport premium funding for academic year 2024 -25

The PE and sport premium is a funding initiative aimed at enhancing physical education and sports in primary schools.

- Designed to improve the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.
- Funding is allocated to eligible schools based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6.
- Aims to increase participation in physical activities and improve overall health and fitness.

Funding Amount for Goostrey Community Primary School was £18,100

This document reports on the expenditure of the PE sport premium grant across various categories in a school.

CPD Spending

- Total spending on CPD: £7,875
- External training courses: £0
- Upskilling staff for swimming lessons: £1,200
- Internal learning development: £0
- Inter-school development sessions: £0
- Online training/resource development: £795
- External coaches for confidence and competence: £5,880

Internal Activities Spending

- Total spending on internal activities: £5,910
- School-based extra-curricular opportunities: £2,170

Total Expenditure

- **Total spent of PE sports premium: £21,801 (overspend of £3,701)**

The PE sport premium grant expenditure allowed for opportunities, impacts, and sustainability in physical education, as below;

Opportunities in Sport

- Targeted spending on SEND pupils includes top-up swimming lessons and specialist coaching.
- Initiatives to improve girls' access to PE include community club engagement and focused activities.
- Disadvantaged pupils benefit from free before and after-school sports activities and subsidized clubs.
- Inter-school competitions have provided school success in achieving the Gold Games Mark award 2024-25.

Perceived Impacts Improvements

- Funding positively impacted staff confidence and knowledge in teaching PE.
- Increased engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity was noted, with emphasise on sportsmanship in competitions.
- The profile of PE across the school has improved, supporting overall school improvement.

Participation and Attainment

- Positive impacts on offering a broader range of sports and increasing competitive participation.
- Achievements include increased pupil attainment in PE and swimming water safety.
- Notable improvements in teacher confidence and competence in teaching PE.
- 24 cluster events attended
- Overall cluster partnership winner 2024-25
- 64% of KS2 pupils took part in extracurricular competitions.
- 8 wrap-around sport clubs offered throughout the year.

Sustainability

- Funding has ensured that improvements made in PE are sustainable.

Swimming Water Safety

- 89% of Year 6 pupils can swim competently over 25 meters.
- 89% can effectively use a range of strokes.
- 86% can perform safe self-rescue in various water situations.
