



24th November - Woodland Trust Big Climate Fightback at the Scout Hut

Our young people consistently tell us that protecting our environment is one of the most important things they care about. On Sunday 24th November Cub Leader, Paul Kemsley, is inviting all young people from babes-in-arms through to young adults to drop in at the Scout Hut and Youth Centre with their families between 10:00 am and 2:00 pm to help plant our wildlife hedge as part of the Woodland Trust's Big Climate Fightback. Please bring a spade, energy and enthusiasm – and hope for dry weather!

Countdown to Christmas

The Scouts run a range of events for the community each year, which help to raise funds and/or support the work of the Parish Council. The countdown to Christmas is a very busy period.

The Christmas Light Switch on Event will be held at its usual location on the Bogbean on Sunday 1 December from 5 pm onwards, when Santa will, we hope, be able to call in to meet children, while seasonal fayre will be on offer including mulled wine, mince pies, BBQ food and hot drinks and cakes. Join in singing Christmas carols to music performed by the Rode Hall Silver Band - which is kindly funded by a donation from the Parish Council.

Watch out for **Santa's Sleigh in the first week of December.** Santa is planning to visit Goostrey West during the evening of **Wednesday 4 December**, and Goostrey East on **Thursday 5 December**, ably assisted by some of 1st Goostrey's Scout Leaders and parents. Bring the children out to meet him.

The route on December 4th **Goostrey West** will be: Main Road both sides from Long Shoot, Hermitage Lane, New Platt Lane, Boothbed Lane, Forest Avenue, Mulberry Avenue and others.

On December 5th - Goostrey East: Main Road (north side), Mill Lane, Woodlands, Buckbean Way, Brooklands Drive (and side roads), Station Road, Main Road (south side to Long Shoot)

 $1^{\rm st}$ Goostrey Scouts have invited all our Scouts, Cubs and Beavers to help underprivileged children by showing support for the Toy Appeal 2019. All our Scout members have been asked to try to bring a new, unwrapped toy suitable for any age group from 0-17 to the drop off point in the hallway at the Scout Hut & Youth Centre before Saturday 7 December. Last year the Toy Appeal provided a sack of toys to 3800 children who would not otherwise have received any presents on Christmas Day.

This year, the Toy Appeal, a charity run by Chris and Dee Drake from Twemlow Green, is keen to increase the number of children helped to 5000. TAKING CHILDREN ON HOLIDAY DURING TERM TIME

A guide for parents and carers

Frequently asked questions

Am I entitled to take my child out of school for a family holiday?
□ No. Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school or the alternative provision on a regular basis
☐ The Education Act 1996 makes it a criminal offence for a parent to "fail to secure their child's regular attendance at the school"
□ The amendments to the 2006 Regulations remove any reference to <i>family holidays, extended</i> leave and the statutory threshold of ten school days.
☐ The amendments make clear that Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances
☐ The amendments give parents no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time
□ The Head Teacher and Governing Body will determine what the exceptional circumstances are
If we decide to take a holiday during term time what should we do?
☐ The parent/carer with whom the child resides must apply in writing to the school ☐ The letter/application must explain the exceptional circumstance surrounding the request for the leave of absence
What will the school do then?
☐ The Head Teacher will determine whether the exceptional circumstance ruling applies, if not the application will be declined
 Only the Headteacher (or the Deputy) has the power to approve leave of absence applications. When making the decision the protocols and criteria laid down in the school's attendance policy must be followed.
 Each academic year, schools inform parents/carers via a letter, newsletter or some other communication; that they may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice if their child has unauthorised absences in term time
□ You will receive a written response from the Headteacher (or the Deputy) letting you know if your application has been approved
$\hfill \square$ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded as unauthorised

what will happen it the absence is unauthorised?
☐ The school will decide if a Penalty Notice should be issued. If the school decide that a Per
alty Notice is to be issued
 You will receive a letter from the school advising that it has referred the matter to the Loca
Authority and that a Penalty Notice may be issued;
☐ The school will inform the Local Authority that a Penalty Notice needs to be issued
□ A Penalty Notice will be sent to you, accompanied by an explanatory letter; the Notice gives you the opportunity to pay a penalty fine instead of being prosecuted in the criminal courts

Payments will **not** be accepted after the 28th day and payments **cannot** be paid in part or by instalments
