



Annual Governance Statement for the Governing Board
Goostrey Primary School

July 2022

In accordance with the Government's requirement for all governing boards, the four core strategic functions are:

1. Ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
2. Hold the Head Teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils;
3. Oversee the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.
4. Promote the highest possible standards for safeguarding

The Governing Board of Goostrey Primary School consists of 5 parent governors, 1 Local Authority governor, 1 staff governor, 6 co-opted governors and the Headteacher. Co-opted governors are appointed by the Governing Board and are people who, in the opinion of the Governing Board, have the skills required to contribute to the effective governance and success of the school. Our governors undertake a skills audit at the beginning of each year, and attend training and refresher training to ensure they continue to have the appropriate mix of skills and expertise to effectively undertake its functions.

The full Governing Board meet once each term, and there are also two committees who consider different aspects of the school in detail:

Personnel and Curriculum Committee - this committee spends time:

- Considering key data around pupils' achievement and attainment, to ensure that the school is on track to fulfil its ambitious targets for all pupils.
- Focusing on the progress and wellbeing of all our pupils and ensuring "vulnerable groups" of children are effectively supported by the Pupil Premium Grant.
- Discussing the impact of relevant initiatives and programmes, for example the Sports' Grant.
- Reviewing all areas of the curriculum, Special Educational Needs and arrangements for assessment.
- Considering all staffing matters and leading on recruitment, HR, staff development and appraisal.

Finance and Premises Committee – this committee spends time;

- Planning the maintenance and development of the school premises.
- Ensuring our Health and Safety and Building Compliance Inspections are carried out by independent inspectors with the School Business Manager.
- Overseeing safeguarding and receiving regular reports.
- Approving the budget in the summer term and reviewing 3-year budget projections and ensuring all external audits, returns and reports have been actioned.

One of the roles for the governors is reviewing and agreeing school policies, and this year we have considered a number of key policies in line with statutory requirements and good practice. Statutory policies can be found on the school website.

Governors have key subject and specific areas of responsibility, for example, safeguarding, disadvantaged pupils, SEND. Each class have their own link governor who is encouraged to visit and spend time with the children. The governors write reports for the summer term's Headteacher's Report giving an overview of the work and impact in their subject / area. You can see the full list of governors with a brief

There is a comprehensive programme of training for governors.

Minutes of the Governing Board are public documents, once they have been approved by the board and signed by the chair. Full board meeting minutes are available on the school website. At the end of every meeting governors consider and record the positive impact they have had on the pupils.

Future plans for the governors 2022/23

Governors will continue to carry out all their duties and responsibilities to a high standard. They are determined that the children will get the best provision possible and to this end will:

- Continue with regular visits to school to monitor the impact of school's priorities
- Understand and contribute to school development, recommendations from external audits, including Ofsted and School Partner visits and all relevant data
- Monitor the impact of the teaching and learning - whole curriculum, intent, implementation and impact
- Monitor budget projections
- Address the wellbeing of staff and pupils

As part of the improvements needed to maintain our excellent school we continue to work hard to be an effective partner for all our families and the community.

The rolling programme of building improvements continue and governors monitor progress and review the 3 year building plan. We continually update the IT resources in order to equip our children with the technology they need.

Attendance record of governors

Governors have excellent attendance at meetings and we have never cancelled a meeting because it was not “quorate” (the number of non – staff governors needed to ensure that legal decisions can be made is 3).
