

Dear Parents,

COVID update—thank you for all your support and understanding this week—more information about the timeline the school worked to, regarding the recent class isolating is on page 2. This is intended to reassure all families that school acted as quickly as possible from the time they were notified about the positive case. The family of the child who tested positive have very kindly sent in some thoughts, on page 2, that other families may find useful.

On Thursday we emailed out to families a quick guide for action re COVID-19—this can also be found on pages 5 & 6.

From next Monday—if your child is absent for school for any of the reasons on the guick guide then we will provide remote learning within 24 hours, of a working school day from their first day of absence. However, it is not sustainable, to provide work, for families who are choosing to keep their child /ren off school when they have been told they can return. Remote learning is not available for children off school, poorly with other conditions. Please refer to the quick quide and let us know why your child is isolating. If your child is unwell with any other illness then please, as usual keep them at home. If your child is well and you would usually send them to school then please do so. Children being settled and in a good routine of school is extremely important and education should never be optional.

Health and Safety reminder—the children have grown taller over lockdown and their hair has grown longer! Please remember that the school policy is that any child with hair below their shoulders will need to tie it back when in school.

Holiday dates 21 22 are now on the school website.

REMINDER: we are offering individual, family tours (socially distanced) after school throughout the autumn term. Please let any interested families know as we would love to meet with them and show them all our school has to offer. One family's experience FYI

Over the last few days of the summer holidays, we had my niece, her husband and one of my nephews to stay at our home. All three were in good health and in the same family bubble. They left on Thursday morning.

On Saturday, my son mentioned that he had a slight headache and was tired. Given he'd had a couple of late nights and played football that morning, we assumed he was slightly dehydrated or just tired. He took some Calpol and was fine later that day.

The next day, Sunday, he was his usual self and we thought no more of it. On Monday, both our children returned to school as planned and had great days. By the Tuesday morning, I felt a little more tired than usual and by mid-morning started to get a headache and feel rather fatigued. Later on Tuesday morning, my niece contacted me to say that both her and her husband, as well as my nephew had tested positive for Covid.

None of them had any symptoms at all but had been contacted by the government and advised to test as a work colleague of my nephew had tested positive. At that stage, we immediately contacted both schools and collected both children. We have been isolating since.

My wife started developing mild symptoms the next day: a headache and aching muscles/limbs. We drove to a test station on Wednesday evening and were all tested. Over Thursday and Friday, for the majority of the time we have felt absolutely fine with symptoms perhaps more associated with a cold or slight flu. This comes in waves and a lot of the time we feel absolutely normal. At no time have we displayed any of the three key symptoms mentioned in the government information. In fact, none of us have registered a temperature beyond 36.8 degrees.

Late on Friday night, we received the results that three of us are positive for Covid including my youngest son. We'd seen news reports that children may appear asymptomatic and this does appear to have been the case for us. We're hoping that by sharing this it may help other families understand the greater variety of symptoms that may indicate Covid.

Timeline for one class isolating at our school:

21:45 Friday 11th September I was informed one child in our school had tested Positive for Covid and this had been brought in to school from the community. Advice to schools is to take no further action until a child or member of staff tests positive.

22:00 to 23:00 I liaised with relevant staff members, gathering information and discussing next steps.

23:00 to midnight I was fortunate to be able to speak with Public Health England immediately (at such a late hour), who risk assessed the situation and instructed me regarding what to do next. Staff and I then cancelled all our family plans for the weekend to focus on this.

09:00 Saturday 12th September I met with the two class teachers in school. After lengthy and detailed discussions with both Public Health England and an official from Cheshire East, we followed their advice, composing and sending letters out to the families of children who were close contacts and needed to isolate, as well as letters to the families whose children did not need to isolate. The rest of the day, staff were organising remote learning for the class and I was responding to emails and phone calls etc from staff and families. I left school at **16:00** but continued to communicate with relevant parties from home.

13:00 Sunday **13th** September I was in school until **17.00** with the Deputy Headteacher again, responding to queries and ensuring we had covered everything that we needed to.

I am so grateful to everyone who supported me last weekend, both in school and remotely, and very proud at how quickly, at a weekend, we gathered all the necessary information together ready for the new school week.

As each day passes we are given new and updated information. It appears that when one child is tested positive, and has been in school, that the whole class then has to isolate. This could happen again in the future and I promise you, as always, school will act as quickly as possible to keep you informed while following all the correct procedures and advice.

COVID-19 (coronavirus) absence: A quick guide for parents / carers



What to do if	Action needed	Back to school
my child has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	 Child shouldn't attend school Child should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results 	when child's test comes back negative
my child tests positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	 Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for at least 10 days from when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) Inform school immediately about test results Whole household self-isolates for 14 days from day when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 14 days 	when child feels better, and has been without a fever for at least 48 hours They can return to school after 10 days even if they have a cough or loss of smell / taste. These symptoms can last for several weeks once the infection is gone.
in my household has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	 Child shouldn't attend school Household member with symptoms should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results 	when household member test is negative, and child does not have COVID-19 symptoms*
somebody in my household has tested positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Whole household self-isolates for 14 days from day when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 14 days	when child has completed 14 days of self-isolation, even if they test negative during the 14 days
