



RSPB Big Garden Bird Watch

The RSPB annual Big Garden Bird Watch takes place between January 29th and January 31st.

If you wish to take part then simply sign up online at rspb.org.uk/birdwatch.

You can choose any one-hour slot during these 3 days to count the birds you see in your garden.

You can download a garden bird identification sheet and instructions from the RSPB if you wish.

You then notify the RSPB with your results using their online form.

It's very easy to take part and is also fun spotting different birds!

Thanks to people taking part in the Big Garden Birdwatch, we now have over 40 years of data and this has helped increase our understanding of the challenges faced by wildlife.

Results like these help us spot problems. But, more importantly, they are the first step towards putting things right. - RSPB

Change in Isolation Date for Close Contacts

The [Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection](#) has changed meaning that self-isolation for contacts of people with confirmed coronavirus has shortened from 14 to 10 days.

Key summary points of the new isolation guidance include:

As of **Monday 14th December 2020**, the isolation period reduced to 10 days.

Isolation periods will take the day contact occurred as Day 0 of the isolation period, so contacts must remain in isolation until Day 11.

COVID-19 (coronavirus) absence: A quick guide for parents / carers
